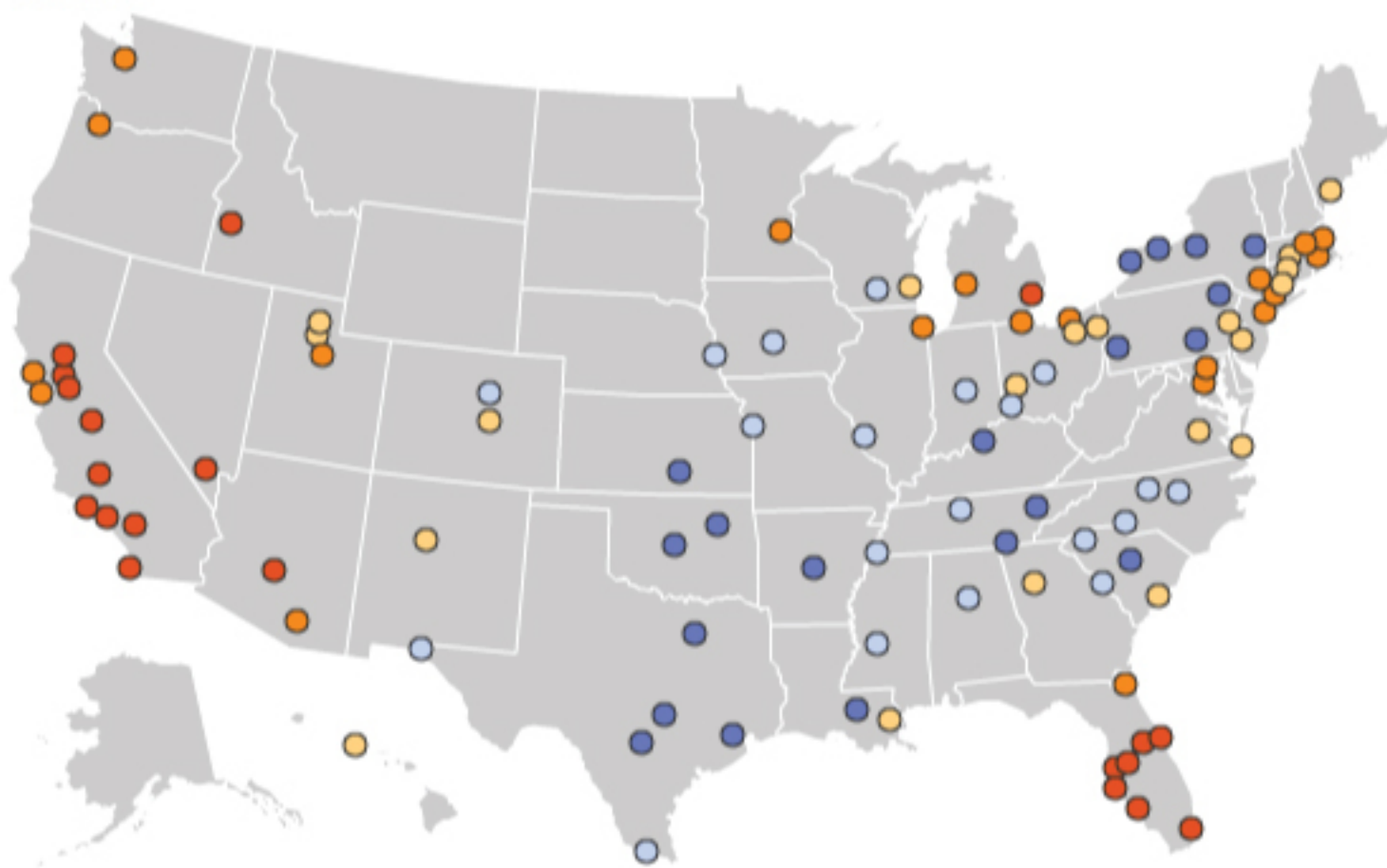


Change in Housing Prices in the Largest 100 Metros

Percent change in the inflation-adjusted house price index (HPI), from peak HPI to the third quarter of 2010.



Average change in housing prices for 100 largest metropolitan areas: -22.6%
Average change in housing prices for the United States: -17.4%

- Strongest 20 metros (-7.8 to -3.4 percent)
- Second-strongest 20 metros (-13.2 to -7.8 percent)
- Middle 20 metros (-19.3 to -13.3 percent)
- Second-weakest 20 metros (-32.7 to -20.2 percent)
- Weakest 20 metros (-59.4 to -33.4 percent)
